WHAT'S HAPPENING IN MAY

The bees are nearly at full swing. There will still be a few cold snaps, especially in early May, but by the last two weeks, the weather is good for bees to rapidly expand and to start bringing in more and more nectar and pollen. The queen should be laying well now. The hive should be expanding rapidly.

WHAT TO PREPARE FOR IN JUNE

Bees are expanding rapidly – watch for overcrowding. Continue to inspect every 7-10 days.- Monitor colonies for queen cells, pests, and diseases. Check brood pattern to make sure your queen is laying well. Add another super if needed.
