January February Hive Happenings



January: What are the Bees Doing? The bees are in a tight cluster staying warm and eating UP the honey stores. You may notice dead bees outside the hive which is normal. On days when temps are warmer, you may see them out flying (Cleansing flight).

What you should be doing: Typically, a hands-off month for interacting with bees. Ensure entrance is clear of snow for ventilation, check apiary for damage and do needed repairs. On warmish days 45,° you can "pop the top" and do a 'Steve Sneak a Peek" no longer than 30 seconds, to assess amount of stored honey and feed if needed – Do NOT remove frames. Join local Beekeeping association, take a class, read and ORDER BEES

February: What are the bees doing? Expect the bees to be higher up in the boxes. Days are becoming longer and bees are acting similar to January → The bees are in a tight cluster staying warm and eating UP the honey stores. You may notice dead bees outside the hive which is normal. On days when temps are warmer, you may see them out flying (Cleansing flight).

What you should be doing: Emergency/ Insurance feeding: Honey is best. White granulated table sugar can be used. If you have not ordered your bees, ORDER NOW! Be sure to order needed equipment now or you may find it backordered. Educate yourself!

Looking ahead to March: High risk for starve out - make sure food is readily available. Brood rearing has started. Clean and prepare equipment. Continue educating yourself.
