PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear BCBA Members.

On the day of our last meeting, Steve Hupfer, friend and mentor to many club members, died unexpectedly while working in his bee yard. He was a self-taught Master Beekeeper and lifelong learner who gave his time to provide guidance and support to the club in multiple ways. Providing education in the Intro to Beekeeping class to attending all the club meetings asking probing questions, Steve was always keeping us thinking.

Steve had his own style of teaching in the moment. Just yesterday I heard someone say, "I just wanted the answer." It made me smile because I've heard that from others before. To be truly successful in beekeeping it's important to consider your goals and understand "the why" before taking a course of action. Those that reached out to Steve with questions knew

there would be no short, one size fits all answer, but at the end of that usually long conversation would walk away a smarter beekeeper.

Steve was a 25 year club member and past President. He had a passion for the club and its rich history. He told me at an Intro to Beekeeping Class that he felt like a "Proud Papa", because the club was moving forward and in good hands with members who shared his passion for learning and teaching.

He was truly one of a kind.

Steve's Beekeeping Legacy

Steve was a queen breeder and kept multiple hives, typically in nucrearing wooden-ware. Upon his passing, Sarah Mueller, fellow BCBA member, is kind enough to help Steve's widow manage his beekeeping "estate". Due to bees being livestock and needing immediate redistribution from Steve's apiary, I sent an email earlier this morning with the following information. Broodminder

Part of the Club's mission is to keep abreast of new technologies available in beekeeping. Some of the new hive monitoring capabilities have been of particular interest to many in the Club. Back in 2019 Rich Morris, CEO of Broodminder spoke at a club meeting. Broodminder is a Wisconsin company and a leader in this space. To help members augment the Broodminder costs the club approved \$1,500 in funds for the Brown County Beekeepers program.

MITE CHECK YOUR NUCS!

BCBA discusses mites in almost every conversation we have. There's a reason for that! Varroa mites are one of the biggest treats to our hives and our bee's health. On 5/20 I purchased and installed a "certified mite free" nuc, adding a 3rd hive to my apiary. On 5/25 I mite checked all 3 of my hives (by means of powdered sugar shake). My existing hives came out "clean" with no mites detected. My brand new hive produced 14 mites! Luckily I have formic pro on hand and immediately treated my hive. I will treat with 1 pad for 10 days, come back, remove pad 1 and repeat with another pad for another 10 days. This is label option #2, and because I killed a queen using label option #1 earlier this month, this is the option I will always use. I will mite check all my hives monthly.
