# NATIONAL SURVEY INDICATES HIGHEST BEE COLONY LOSSES IN 14 YEARS

U.S. beekeepers lost an estimated 55.1% of their managed bee colonies in 2023-24 – 14.8 percentage points higher than the 13-year average annual loss rate of 40.3%.

This surge in colony losses was driven largely by losses among commercial beekeepers managing more than 500 colonies.

"Backyard beekeepers traditionally experience greater losses than commercial beekeepers, but this time around it was flipped
